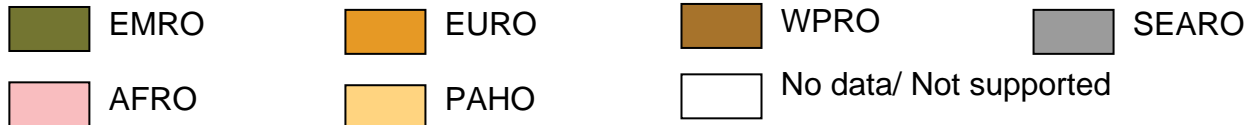
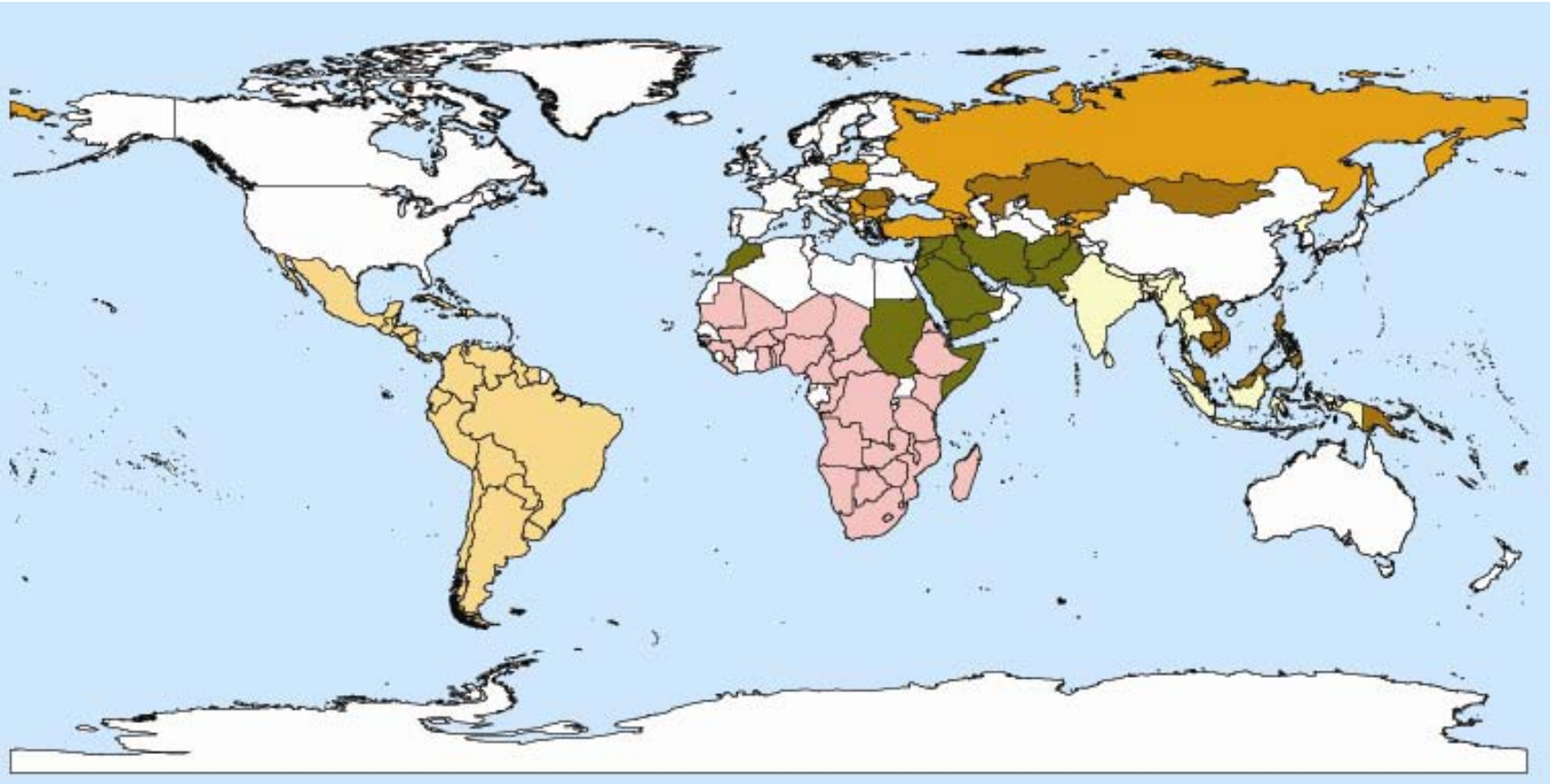
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Countries with WHO-supported emergency preparedness programmes

- Variability in national and community preparedness
- Nearly all countries surveyed had a disaster in the past 5 years
- All countries should be prepared for disasters BUT ...capacity is limited
